**Peyton Alt
WAYNE**

A two-year starter at guard for the Generals, this 286-pound beast helped the Generals rack up big offensive numbers in 2022 – both in passing and in rushing (301 total yards per game).



**Justin Anderson
CARROLL**

Anderson earned first-team All-SAC honors after contributing 33 solo tackles, five tackles for loss, five pass breakups and two picks for the conference and semi-state champions.



**Drew Baker
LEO**

This senior linebacker led the Northeast 8 with 21.5 TFLs, while tallying 74 total takedowns, three QB sacks, one interception (which he returned for a TD) and one fumble recovery.



**Brady Beall
SOUTH ADAMS**

The senior tight end/receiver had 54 receptions for 660 yards and 11 touchdowns in '22 on "O," while adding 89 tackles, eight tackles for loss and four fumble recoveries on defense.



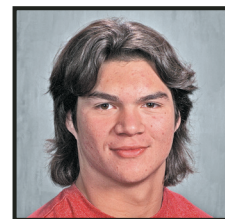
**Ke'Drell Billingsley
SNIDER**

CHURUBUSCO**

Buroff was awesome in 2022 with 913 passing yards and 628 rushing yards on offense. He averaged 40.6 yards per punt and had two returns for touchdowns on special teams.



**Collin Butler
LEO**

The Saint Francis commit was a two-time first-team All-NE8 selection, anchoring the Lions' line this past season in the wake of two DI departures (Demetrius Allen and Landen Livingston).



**Dominic Chacon
COLUMBIA CITY**

This inside linebacker recorded a school-record 119 tackles this past season, while chipping in 11 TFLs, two QB sacks and two fumble recoveries for the NE8-champion Eagles.



**Jackson Christmon
HOMESTEAD**

Facing extra blocking attention on virtually every snap in 2022, Christmon nonetheless recorded 8.5 QB sacks, 14.5 TFLs, 39 tackles, one interception and two forced fumbles for Sparty.



**Gavin Cook
ADAMS CENTRAL**

Pound for pound, this feisty safety was one of the toughest players in the GN Nation in '22. He finished with 88 tackles, five TFLs and five pass breakups for the 1A state runners-up.



**Bubba Craig
CONCORDIA**

Big Bubba was a dominating force along both lines for the Cadets in 2022, but was most impressive as a road-clearing offensive tackle where he earned first-team All-SAC honors.



**Anthony Cruz
BLUFFTON**

The talented ball-carrier ran for 1,513 yards and 13 TDs in '22, earning first-team All-ACAC. Cruz was the Tigers' offensive MVP in helping Bluffton to its first sectional crown since '88.



**Mickey Daring
BISHOP LUERS**

Daring dared to make an impact on both sides of the ball last season, but landed a spot on the All-GN team at DT with 49 tackles, 10 TFLs, four QB sacks and three forced fumbles.

BISHOP DWENGER**

The Marshall-bound Davis was sensational in '22, leading the Saints in interceptions (five) and total tackles (75). He also had 380 receiving yards and five touchdown receptions on "O."

NORTH SIDE**

Recently committed to Saint Francis to play for the Cougars, Dickerson was named second-team All-SAC after throwing for over 2,600 yards and compiling 53 total touchdowns in 2022.

CARROLL**

Dierckman was a second-team all-conference cornerback, but came up with huge plays in the playoffs. He finished the season with four interceptions and 11 pass breakups.

NORTH SIDE**

Offentimes, Doughty was unblockable this past season. He led the area with 15 quarterback sacks to go along with 21 tackles for loss in earning first-team All-SAC accolades.



**Mikey Dye
NORTH SIDE**

This lockdown corner just gave his verbal commitment to Marian University in Indianapolis. He was named to the Summit Athletic Conference's second team in 2022.



**Lincoln Firks
SNIDER**

The Saint Charles product was one of the most improved players over the past few seasons, hauling in seven touchdowns, receptions in '22 and dominating as a run-blocker.

COLUMBIA CITY**

Fuller returns to the All-GameNight awards poster after another big season on both sides of the ball. He had 53 receptions for 860 yards and 12 TDs on "O," and six picks on defense.



**Luke Graft
NORWELL**

The senior RB/LB had 904 rushing yards and 14 TD rushing yards on offense, while excelling on defense, too, with 65 takedowns, 16.5 TFLs, six QB satchels and three takeaways.



**Hansen Haffner
CARROLL**

One of the best high-point receivers in the GameNight Nation, Haffner had 37 receptions for 479 yards and 10 touchdowns in '22. Look for Haffner to have a huge senior season next year.



**Da'Von Haney
NORTH SIDE**

Haney, a first-team All-SAC selection at defensive tackle, contributed 38 tackles, three tackles for loss, three QB satchels and two forced fumbles for the 8-5 Legends.



**Luke Hauptert
SNIDER**

Snider's first-ever three-year starter under center, Hauptert finished the 2022 campaign with 1,569 aerial yards and 23 TD tosses (against just four picks) on 62-percent passing.



**Grant Hayworth
CONCORDIA**

A lanky defensive end, Hayworth led the Cadets' defense with 75 quarterback sacks to go along with 12 tackles for loss and 61 total tackles. He also had five pass deflections.



**Cam Herschberger
CARROLL**

The senior WR was the epitome of a possession guy in 2022. When Carroll needed someone open at the sticks, it was often this guy. He led the Chargers with 779 receiving yards.



**Julante Hinton
NORTHROP**

The two-way standout is back on the All-GameNight squad after leading the Bruins in tackles this past year (50 solos, 19 assists), while chipping in six tackles for loss.



**Alex Holcomb
LEO**

Holcomb was the second-leading tackler in the NE8 (playing in one fewer game than the conference leader), finishing with 114 tackles, 13 TFLs and 4.5 quarterback satchels.



**Aiden Hunley
CARROLL**

A senior OT for the areas best team, Hunley helped the Chargers amass 4,275 yards during the 2022 season (305 yards per game). He was named first-team All-SAC this past season.



**Tegan Irk
DEKALB**

Second on the Barons' all-time passing list, Irk threw for 2,386 yards and 24 scores in 2022. Ranked fourth in his graduating class, Irk holds six passing records at DeKalb High.



**Carsen Jacobs
EASTSIDE**

Jacobs was sensational on both sides of the ball in '22. On offense, he had 1,320 rushing yards and 808 aerial yards (with 25 combined TDs). On defense, he had four picks and 34 tackles.



**Tae Tae Johnson
NORTH SIDE**

Johnson will return to North Side next season as one of the state's most coveted recruits. This past season, he led the Legends with 1,081 receiving yards and 17 touchdowns.



**Kolin Jolas
BISHOP LUERS**

The senior linebacker had a sensational season for the semistate-bound Knights, registering 104 tackles, 15 TFLs, three quarterback sacks and two forced fumbles in 2022.



**Jordan King
NORTH SIDE**

The junior OG was a finalist for GN's Lineman of the Year award, returning to the area's premier postseason team. King currently holds offers from IU, Purdue and Louisville, among others.



**Dylan Krehl
EAST NOBLE**

The sophomore made a statement on both sides of the ball in '22: 79 tackles, nine TFLs and two takeaways on "D," plus 603 rushing yards (6.6 ypc) and six touchdowns on offense.



**Langston Leavell
SNIDER**

A senior RB who eclipsed the 1,000-yard rushing plateau (finishing with 1,170) late in the season, Leavell "played his best in our biggest games." Snider coach Kurt Tippmann said.



**Grant Leeper
HOMESTEAD**

Leeper, a 6-foot-7 athlete who's garnering DI offers after just one season of high school football, tallied 27 receptions for 376 yards and six TDs from his tight end position this past season.



**Zack Leighty
EAST NOBLE**

The 6-foot-3, 285-pound junior lineman is beginning to get collegiate looks for his tenacity on the offensive side of the ball. The Knights averaged 158 rushing yards per game in '22.



**Lain Lengerich
ADAMS CENTRAL**

One of the top trenchmen in the area, Lengerich helped the AC offense accumulate 5,517 total yards in 2022. On "D," he led AC with three forced fumbles and contributed six TFLs.



**Max Loeffler
LEO**

The Lions' senior running back led the Northeast 8 in rushing yardage with 1,491 yards to go along with 16 touchdowns. He also recorded two interceptions for 42 yards and a score.



**Brandon Logan
SNIDER**

Already committed to play baseball for national-power Vanderbilt, Logan is one of the area's best free safeties on the gridiron, too. The sophomore ballhawk had four interceptions in 2022.



**Harold Mack
WAYNE**

The sophomore receiver had 36 receptions for 499 yards and six touchdowns in '22, including a long of 79 yards. He was a finalist for GameNight's Newcomer of the Year award.



**Jack Maley
COLUMBIA CITY**

Coined "The Mauler" by Around the Fort's "Cowboy Joe" Walburn, Maley was named first-team All-NE8 at guard. "My opinion – the best O-lineman in the conference," coach Brett Fox said.

SNIDER**

The senior D-end was Snider's defensive MVP at season's end, earning All-SAC honors with 60 tackles, six TFLs, two fumble recoveries and two quarterback sacks for the 11-2 Panthers.



**Wyatt Marks
CHURUBUSCO**

Marks earned high marks as a first-team All-NECC running back this past season, leading Busco with 1,192 rushing yards (6.3 ypc) and 11 rushing touchdowns for the 8-3 Eagles.

BISHOP DWENGER**

Minix, a junior three-way standout, had solid numbers for BD in 2022: 448 receiving yards and five TD grabs, three kick/punt returns for scores, 21 tackles, five pass breakups.

BISHOP DWENGER**

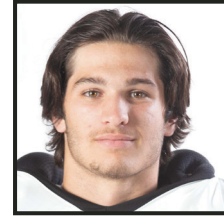
**Ashton Pesetski

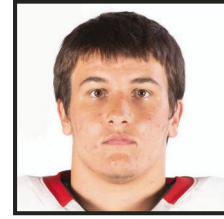
**Andre Tagliaferri
