TONIGHT: South Adams hits the road for an intriguing date with the 3-0 Heritage Patriots. Patty is coming off of a 28-6 victory over the Woodlan Warriors in Woodburn last Friday. "They are much bigger and faster than us," Moser said of the Patriots. "We will need to be very fundamental and well coached to be able to compete." Stud athlete Wes Summersett is finally cleared to play after an offseason injury kept him on the shelf to start the 2024 campaign. "I'm still not sure how much I am going to play him yet," Moser said earlier in the week. If Summersett can get 5-10 touches (whether as a wideout or a running back), that will help alleviate some of the burden placed on Lehman's shoulders. The 6-foot-3 junior QB is another talented signal-caller in a long line of them under Moser's mentorship. He's thrown for 549 yards and six scores on 43-of-71 passing through three weeks of action.

LAST WEEK: The Starfires opened up Allen County Athletic Conference action last Friday night in Berne with a tough loss to the Bluffton Tigers, 33-7. "We had 16 first downs but just couldn't finish drives and execute when it mattered," 10th-year coach Grant Moser said. "Tytus Lehman ran the ball very hard and kept getting up after taking some hard hits." Indeed, Lehman was the Starfires' workhorse last week with 64 rushing yards on 11 carries, while throwing for 112 yards on 12-of-26 passing. "We need to improve on the offensive line as well as in the secondary," Moser said. Derek McKean led the receiving corps with six catches for 57 yards, while Caiden Neuenschwander hauled in a 33-yard reception. The South Adams "D" was led by Nathan Plattner (nine tackles), Grant O'Dell (seven takedowns) and Dillan Ramirez (five tackles). The Starfires avoided the skunk when Lehman hooked up with Jax Wanner on a short touchdown pass in the fourth quarter. Jackson Garcia's extra point closed out the scoring for both teams.
