LAST WEEK: The Lakers improved to 3-0 last Friday night with a dominating 48-6 win over previously unbeaten Prairie Heights. Lakeland actually trailed 6-0 early on, but settled in and scored 41 first-half points en route to the rout. "I am proud of our kids for not panicking at the start of the game," coach Ryan O'Shea said. "It shows our maturity and our belief in our staff and culture." GameNight receiving leader Keyan Arroyo had 119 total yards, two touchdowns on offense; five tackles and a pick on "D." Junior QB Brayden Holbrook was 8-of-11 passing for 116 yards. Levi Cook chipped in five tackles, one QB sack and a pick-six. "Our corner group got better this (past) week, but there's still room for improvement," O'Shea said. "We gave up too many big passing plays." Lakeland seized control when Johnny Colon intercepted a PH pass, setting up a short Holbrook TD run for a 13-6 Lakers lead. "It let us breathe and start playing looser," O'Shea noted. Carson Mickem - the lone Laker to make GameNight's PT-40 - had some tough runs on



TONIGHT: Lakeland (3-0) heads south to square off against fellow unbeaten Garrett tonight in one of the best early-season GameNight games. "Garrett is a really well-oiled machine," O'Shea said. "They run the ball efficiently and No. 2 (senior QB Calder Hefty) is one of the better running quarterbacks you'll see. He's tough and fast, and if you sleep on his arm he'll throw it over your head." Mickem (pictured) and fellow inside backer Drannon Miller will share "spy" duties on Hefty, while the D-end duo of Nick Huppenthal and Keegan Merrifield will be extra careful to keep the Garrett QB in the pocket. In this matchup last year, Hefty rushed for 174 yards and two TDs in leading the Railroaders to an 18-9 victory. The Lakeland ground game, conversely, produced just 64 yards on 22 official carries a year ago vs. Garrett.

LAST WEEK: The Railroaders took care of business early on last Friday night, wasting no time in dismantling Churubusco's Eagles 41-zip. "Overall a good performance by the kids handling a 'trap' game," coach Chris DePew said shortly afterward, referencing tonight's clash vs. Lakeland. DePew gave special praise to the beasts (pictured) in his offensive trenches: Nate Wells, Aiden Hunt, Cam Woods, Owen Baldwin, Jacob Reynolds and tight end Levi Chaney. "(Cam) Ruble ran hard," DePew said, while also noting Aiden Reed's 100-plus yards on the ground in the fourth quarter alone. The Railroaders put the 'Busco boys to bed on the first offensive snap of the second half when senior QB Calder Hefty bootlegged to his right, evaded

a blitzing Eagle off the edge, and "chucked a 61-yard TD pass to Parker Skelly," DePew recanted. The one glaring aspect that needs improvement? "A couple special-teams turnovers," DePew noted. "We've gotta clean that up."



G-town. "Lakeland has a D1 quarterback (junior Brayden Holbrook) and a lot of talent around him," DePew warned. "They throw the ball around pretty well." Blake Lewis, who sustained a minor ankle injury last week, was listed as questionable for tonight's contest. Otherwise, DePew said, the Railroaders are healthy. Skelly leads the "D" with three pass breakups, though Garrett has yet to record an interception this season. Holbrook threw for 193 yards vs. the Railroaders in 2023, but was just 13-of-27 passing with zero TDs.
