The Saints picked up their first win on the young season last week at North Side, 14-6, after a pair of tough setbacks to open up the campaign. "They are a very well coached team that plays very physical football," Dinan said of the Saints. "For us to be successful we must control the line of scrimmage on both sides of the ball. They opened their season playing two very good teams, and they are a very good team." BD's "D" was lights out last week against area-rushing leader Caleb Kiengele, containing the elusive ball-carrier for most of the night. But the Saints had trouble corralling North Side QB Tristen Newsome, underscoring this week's game plan vs. Sullivan. Carroll OC Andy Papagiannis may try to get more rushing yards from Starks (114 yards in three games) and senior RB Dajaun Green (48 yards on six carries last week; team-leading 9.9 ypc on the season) as the Chargers look to be more balanced in that area. "Nate and Dajaun are both extremely important to what we want to accomplish," Papagiannis said. "The more our offensive line is able to get those guys going, it will create better opportunities for the pass game."

LAST WEEK: Carroll opened up Summit Athletic Conference play last Friday night in resounding fashion: Chargers 49, South Side's Archers 0. The final score was yet another beatdown imposed upon their guests from the south edge of town, as the Chargers have now defeated the Archers by a combined score of 309-12 over the past five seasons. "We got off to a quick start vs. South Side, playing a complete game in all three phases of the game," coach Doug Dinan said on Sunday. "Thus, providing opportunity for many players to see the field in the varsity contest." Carroll raced out to a 42-0 first-half bulge as six different players hit pay-dirt: interior beast Mason Irmiter (a 2-yard run), RB Nate Starks (from 8 yards out), and three TD tosses and one scoring scamper from senior signal-caller Jimmy Sullivan. The Iowa commit was 5-of-9 passing for 102 yards and the three scores (to Brady Rhoad, Jaidon VanPelt and Mason Baughman). Reverend Starks led the ground attack with 69 yards on six attempts. Rhoad (pictured celebrating his score) had three receptions for 43 yards to top the receivers chart. The defense was spearheaded by Eli Neuhouser (five tackles, two tackles for loss and one QB sack) and Asher Wagoner (three tackles, one TFL). Sophomore "Rover" Link Grabner grabbed five solos to pace the Carroll tackles tally. "Defensively, we played well up-front as well as at the linebacker positions," Dinan noted.
