

LAST WEEK: Concordia's 2-0 start was a sweet erasure of last year's 0-10 effort. Last week, however, that savory taste was eventually soured in the form of a 41-6 setback to Snider's Panthers. "We got off to a great start but couldn't sustain that effort, particularly offensively," coach Tim Mannigel told GameNight after the game. "Our defense actually played fairly well, but six turnovers on the offensive side of the ball along with a stubborn refusal to have any semblance of a rushing attack will never get it done. Some of that is Snider's defense; some of that is us. We'll continue to strive to make improvements and get better as a unit." The Cadets had five passes picked off with two of them returned for touchdowns; one of them (pictured) was called back because of a Snider penalty on the return. Still, the Concordia Air Show produced 256 yards and one touchdown - a 16-yard first-quarter score to senior WR Avery Cook, giving the Cadets a 6-0 lead. Senior wideout Jack Belschner led the team with six receptions for 134 yards, while Cook (4-62) and Jalen Campos (2-57) were next in line. The Cadets' run game - as Mannigel referenced - was woeful, producing negative-20 yards on 16 official attempts. The defense was led by junior linebacker Zach Spielman (15 total tackles, one tackle for loss) and sophomore safety Eli Trent (four solos, one pass breakup).
