




would eventually win the game, 28-16. "I thought we played hard most of the night," coach Mike Eshbach said. "There are some areas we certainly need to clean



up." Defensive breakdowns (especially in the second half on a couple of third-and-long situations) and missed opportunities on offense were the dirty little culprits in the Vikes' demise. "I thought we blew opportunities in the first half to get into the end zone," Eshbach said. "There were a couple of times in the second half where we had them backed up and we let them off the hook with long runs." East Noble out-gained Huntington North 364-169 and recorded four interceptions on defense. The HN running game accounted for only 47 yards on 28 official tries. Senior QB Tony Decker - who was featured on the cover of last week's GameNight - was just 10-of-23 passing for 125 yards, and was responsible for the four picks. He was also held to just 20 rushing yards on 11 attempts, well below his 10.4 ypc average coming into the game. Tatum Brooks was Decker's primary dude, hauling in four balls for 113 yards (28.3 ypr) and one touchdown. Punter Eric Frey averaged 38.2 yards per punt on five boots. Brooks, Jimmy Linker and Decker "all had solid games on defense," Eshbach said.
